# A WORD FROM OUR CHAIR

I am honoured to share the 2025 annual report highlighting the commitment and accomplishments of which our Board and staff are justifiably proud. First, on behalf of the Board I extend thanks to Carleton Place Council and staff for their ongoing support through the annual budget allocation and services such as IT, finances, infrastructure, and human resources. Thanks to our outstanding staff who serve our communities with vision, creativity and passion. Last, but certainly not least, thanks to the committed Board trustees who pay attention, make tough decisions when required, and are fair and steady stewards of the Carleton Place Public Library.

Like most other organizations in the area, the Carleton Place Public Library (CPPL) is seeing the impact of the rapidly growing communities we serve. With over 55,000 library visits and 922 new members in 2025 our staff have been challenged to meet demand. The Board recognized the challenges inherent in this growth and, through a restructuring of the budget and careful use of reserves, was able to approve the creation of a Program Coordinator position. The reinforced program team created an annual program plan which has resulted in a 30% increase in program participation over 2024.

In 2025 CPPL continued with existing services and, as always, looked for new ways to reach out to our communities. In addition to ongoing programming with children and youth, an expanded emphasis on senior’s programming has included several new initiatives, such as morning coffee and a new Facebook group for seniors. Through partnership with Lanark and Renfrew Immigrant Settlement Services, we provide free ESL services for newcomers.

The Board and Beckwith Township reached a new three year service agreement which sees residents of Beckwith continue to be provided with free CPPL memberships. Library staff have participated in programs at Beckwith Public School, including a Grades 3 and 4 Real World Project to create literacy kits to complement the Library’s collection of decodable books. The project culminated in a visit by the classes to the Library to present their project. Library staff were also present at both Beckwith Heritage Days and Beckwith Sign-up Night.

I am delighted that we will also be able to look forward to partnership with the newly formed and very enthusiastic Friends of the Carleton Place Public Library. Thanks to Board trustee Linda Guetta for being the driving force to get the Friends group established.

# A YEAR IN REVIEW



In 2025, Carleton Place Public Library strengthened its role as a cornerstone of community life—advancing literacy, creativity, and connection for residents across Carleton Place and Beckwith. We were proud to see Program and Outreach Manager Heidi Sinnett recognized with a Lanark County Asset Builder’s Award, celebrating her outstanding contributions to children and youth.

The Library reinforced its community connections by signing a three-year service contract with the Township of Beckwith, supporting sustainable, collaborative public library service delivery with a valued partner and stakeholder.

Innovation and community engagement were also on display through our Mini Maker Craft Fair, which was shortlisted for an Angus Mowat Award of Excellence—an honour that reflects both staff leadership and the enthusiasm of local makers, families, and partners.

To meet growing demand, the Board invested in capacity by adding a new Program Co-ordinator position—strengthening our ability to deliver high-quality programs and outreach. These efforts were matched by strong community usage, with circulation and programming numbers reaching an all-time high and demonstrating continued trust in the Library as a vital public service.



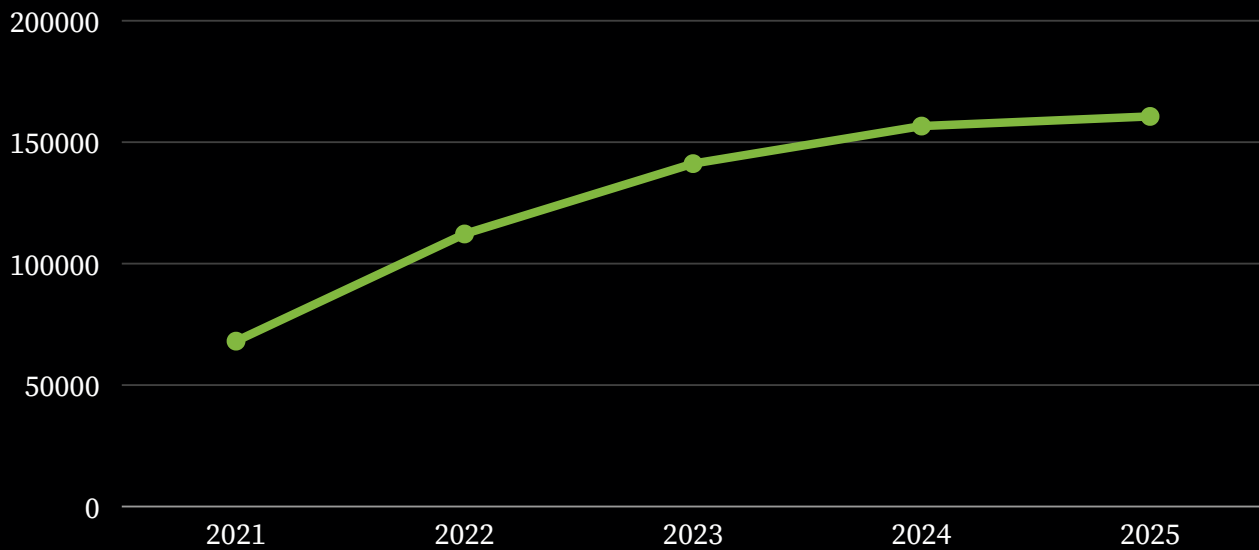

# RECORD-BREAKING CIRCULATION

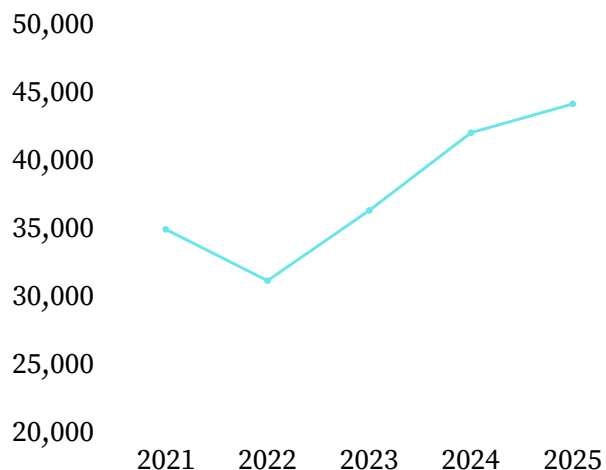

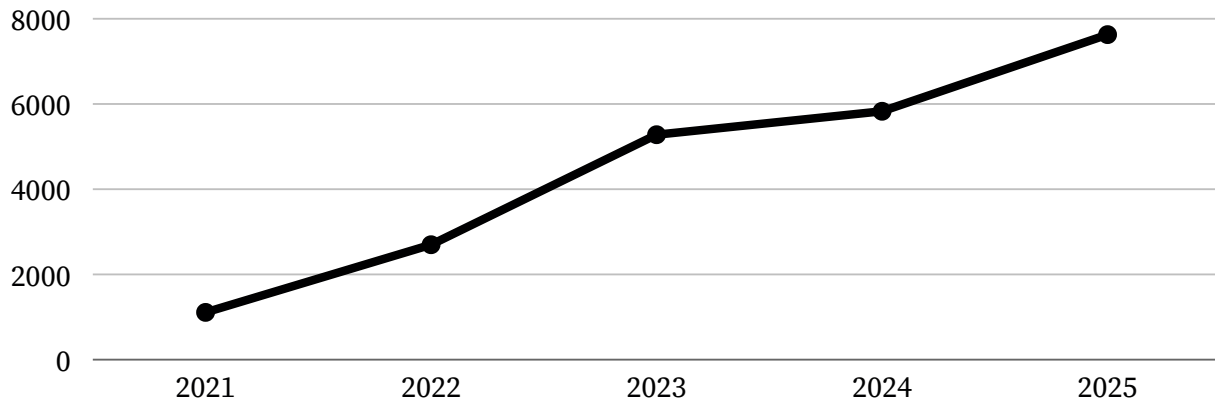


## CONTINUED INTEREST IN DIGITAL MEDIA

- To address the growing interest in library programming, a new Program Co-Ordinator position was created and filled.

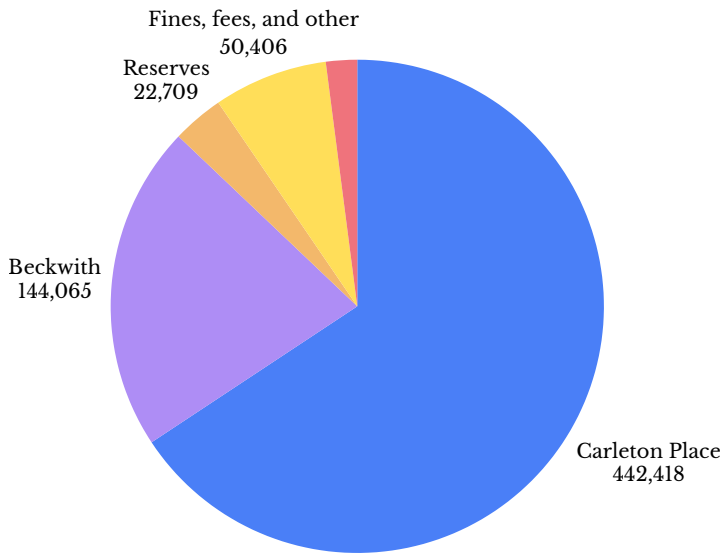
Raise the Profile of the Library in the Community

- The library's Mini-Maker Craft Fair was shortlisted for a Angus Mowat Award for Excellence, placing it among the best library programs in the Province.

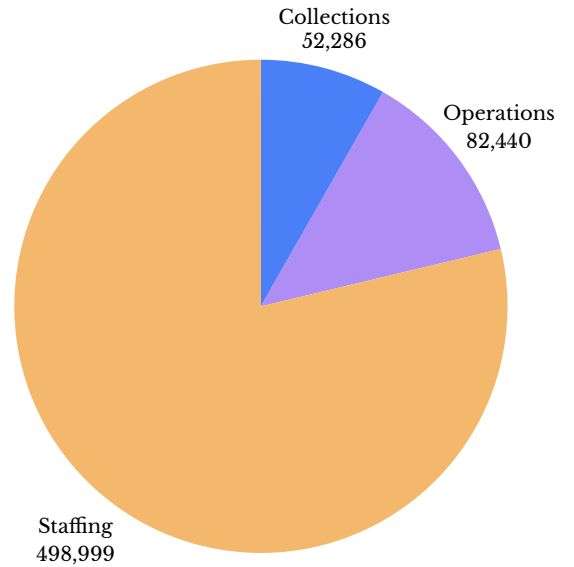

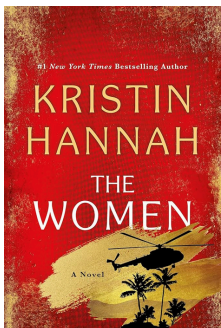


Where library funds come from

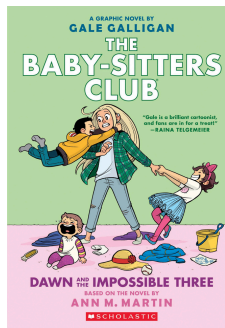


How library funds are used
